Francis the adm'r. of said Barnes in the Commissioners report for the settlement of said estate and taken bonds in sums to correspond to the amount due each legatee according to decree on demand twelve months after date from the 25<sup>th</sup> of July 1846. that being the day of sale of the following slaves -
