John Darden & John Vick for an affray by fighting in public at Richfield Depot in the County of Southampton on the 4th of April 1826 by the witness of William Darden who were sent for by the grand jury.

Augustus J. Stephenson & George W. Spring for an affray by fighting in public in the County of Southampton on the 4th of April 1826 by the witness of Jervis Griffin a member of the grand jury.

The Road leading from the Diamond Bridge to Allen's quarter by information of James D. Vincent a member of the grand jury. And the grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that process be issued against the persons presented by the grand jury this day returnable to the first day of the next quarterly term.

The defendants in this cause this day made their report in their words to wit: "According to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date February term 1825 and hereto annexed, after having advertised as directed by said decree, I have sold at public auction on a credit of twelve months from the 8th day of April 1825, the land and crops there belonging to the est. of James D. Bailey de'. Mr. Tully, Bailey, became the purchaser of the land for the sum of fifty dollars. Henry Ellis became purchaser of the crops amounting to the sum of \$27.8. and Myer Brinkley became the purchaser of the land for the sum of \$181. The annual decree directs the sale of said de'. but right in the down land, but through mistake omitted to order the sale of his right in the down slough, in consequence of which mistake I have thought it best not to sell his right in said lands knowing that there must be another sale to sell the right in the down slough, and thinking it would be best to sell his right in the down property at the same time I have therefore omitted to sell his right in the down slough.
