The following is in this cause this day made this report in these words to wit: Agreeably to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date February Court 1845 and returns aforesaid, after having advertised as directed by such decree, I have sold at public auction on a credit of twelve months from the 5th day of April 1845, the land and negro slave belonging to the estate of James D. Bailey *de* ^d. Mrs. Sally Bailey became the purchaser of the negro woman Patsey for the sum of \$870. and Wyatt Daniels became the purchaser of the land for the sum of \$125. The aforesaid decree directs the sale of said Dec. 2nd right in the above land, but though aforesaid entitled to order the sale of his right in the above slaves, in consequence of which opinion I have thought it best not to sell his right in said lands knowing that there must be another sale to sell the right in the above slaves, and thinking it would be best to sell his right in the above property at the same time I have therefore caused to sell his right in the above slaves. I have on the first place deducted from the amount which I have sold the sum of \$17. for to
