Elijah Ingers late of the County of Southampton laborer who stands indicted of stealing goods and chattels of less value than twenty dollars appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance returned into before the County Court of Southampton on the 18 day of May 1826 and was set to the bars last day of the Sheriff of this County, there assigned and pleaded not guilty to the Indictment Whereupon came a jury to wit John Davney, Edwin Langbein, Thompson B. Rice, Samuel B. Kelle, Shugars Linn, John A. Pierce, Nathaniel Francis, James T. Westbrook James J. Dwyer Nathaniel Simmons Edwin Harris, William Parice. who being called first and sworn the facts to speak of and upon the premises, upon their oath do say that the said Elijah Ingers is guilty of the larceny aforesaid in manner and form as in the Indictment is alleged. And thereupon it appeared to the Court that the said Ingers is not a free man and that he should not be permitted to go at large and that he should be committed to the County Jail for the term of one month in the jail of this County where he is to be kept in law and cease debt as is provided by law, and that he receive no hire back having shops where the stuff is directed to be carried to be sold or disposed of at the following periods to wit, two of each number of stripes returned and the record thereof immediately producing his discharge from jail And thereupon the said Elijah Ingers is committed to jail.
