Elizah Joyner late of the County of Southampton labourer who stands indicted of breaking goods and chattels of less value than twenty dollars appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into before the County Court of Southampton on the 16th day of May 1846 and was set to the service custody of the Sheriff of this County, being arraigned and pleaded not guilty to the indictment wherein cause a jury to wit John Drury, Edwin Daupring, Sampson B. Pease, Samuel D. Kelle, Sturgars Linn, John A. Pease, Nathaniel French, Dennis T. Westbrook, James J. Jordan, Nathaniel Summers, Oliver Morris, William Davis, who being called tried and found the truth to speak of and upon the premises, upon their oaths do say that the said Elizah Joyner is guilty of the larceny aforesaid in manner and form as in the indictment is alleged and therefore it demanded of him if anything furtherwise he had or knew to say why the said Sheriff set him free from judgment and examined against him and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is resolved by the Court that the said Elizah Joyner be imprisoned for the term of one month in the jail of this County whereon he is to be kept on law and course diet as prescribed by law, and that he wear on his breast during his imprisonment the badge of the County to be affixed to his apparel at the following periods to wit, two or three number of stripes inscribed and the word thereof immediately preceding his discharge from jail and thereupon the said Elizah Joyner is remanded to jail.
