On the motion of Henry Blaw. Ordered that William B. Edwards one of the commissioners of this Court do state, settle and adjust an account of said Blaw administrator in the estate of John Wilson dec^d. and make report thereof to Court.

Satisfactory evidence was adduced in Court to prove that John Blythe, William B. Blythe children of Joseph Blythe, and William Blythe, George Blythe, Everett Blythe children of James Blythe the nephews and heirs of William Blythe late a Soldier in the 25th Regiment of Infantry Captain Matthews' company are his only heirs at law.

On the motion of John Boynton and others for leave to open a new road across Swamp to commence at a point about half a mile on the East side of said Swamp and to intersect the road leading from Southfield to Townsboro near the dwelling of Mrs. Francis Lane. It is ordered that James B. Verghart, Thurgate Lane, William B. Hoffmann, Allen Edwards & James C. Clayton or any three of them, being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose, do view the ground along which said road is proposed to be constructed and report to the Court the conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public in case the said road be opened as proposed, and also the probable cost of opening said road.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the Decree entered by which Mrs. Lane was bound to Benjamin Cobb be, and they are hereby affirmed to have past both under of the said Benjamin Cobb according to law.
