Clayton or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose, do view the ground along which said road is proposed to be conducted and respect to the least the convenience and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the publick in case the said road be opened as proposed, and also the probable cost of opening such road.
