And on the motion of James B. Howell the several thence named who came with and together with Alexander Agnew and Thomas B. Howell has severally entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars each conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

The last will and testament of Jesse Gardner dec^d was proved by the oaths of Moses W. Lawrence, Barclay Rowle and Charles Holland the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Jesse Kell and John W. Gardner the several thence named who came with and together with John Moore Jr and A. H. Howell these several entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars each conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that John Moore Jr, Meredith Holland, Matthew Vaughan, Jacob Anthony & H. Howell being three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appear with their personal and seal of Jesse Gardner dec^d which may be to them produced or shown and return the appearance under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Joshua Vink who came with and together with Thomas B. Howell and James S. Dardner has severally entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars each conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the estate of Jacob Vink dec^d in due form.

Benjamin W. Barham who stands committed to the jail of this county for want of security upon the complaint of Lucinda Barham his wife, against him for a breach of the peace, was brought into Court in custody of the jailer of this county. Whereupon Barclay witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Lucinda Barham making oath according to law and requiring security of the peace against the said Barham, and the said Benjamin W. Barham being fully heard, it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Benjamin W. Barham enter into a recognizance himself in the sum of one hundred dollars with two sufficient sureties in the sum of fifty dollars each, conditioned for his keeping the peace and being of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth, especially towards the said Lucinda Barham for the term of twelve months from this term, and that the said Benjamin W. Barham do also pay the costs of this prosecution. And therefore he is committed to jail until he enter into the said recognizance with sufficient security as aforesaid.

Benjamin W. Barham who stands committed to the jail of this county for want of security upon the complaint of Benjamin O. Agnew against him for a breach of the peace, was brought into Court in custody of the jailer of this county. Whereupon Barclay witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Agnew making oath according to law and requiring security of the peace against the said Barham, and the said Barham being fully heard, it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said Benjamin W. Barham enter into a recognizance himself to be bound in the sum of one hundred dollars with two sufficient sureties in the sum of fifty dollars each, conditioned for his keeping the peace and being of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth, especially towards the said Benjamin O. Agnew for the term of twelve months from this day, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution. And therefore he is committed to jail until he enter into the said recognizance with sufficient security as aforesaid.
