Vezubant his accouties entered into and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs and which is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Robert Moret dec'd in due form.

Ordered that John Baynes, John Bowers, Joshua Griffin and Arthur W. Holliman any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Robert Moret dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court.

On the motion of Henry B. Vaughan & writ on the return of a writ of ad quod damnum it is awarded him to be executed on the day of November next to ascertain the damages which the said Vaughan has sustained by seizure of the embankment on the east side of the Northway River since Jeremiah's death and with the request to be taken in possession thereof as to be returned to the next Court.

Seaboard D. C. Carter is appointed surveyor of the road from the Cypress Swamp to Dick's Swamp on the river of William W. Butler deceased and it is ordered that the usual bonds be made thereon.
