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On the motion of Lawrence Pope against Benjamin Ladd. This day came into the Court house attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant had had legal notice of the action he was solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant, twenty three dollars thirty seven cents with legal interest thereon from the 16th day of April 1888 till paid and his costs by him about less but on this behalf expended. And the said defendant in May 1888

The Court proceeded to elect a Constable to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of Richard Parker - and the vote of the Court being taken and now recited as follows.

For Gordy Bishop the votes were G. A. H. Newson, J. D. Bryant, Benj' G. P., Jacob Barrett & Alexander Myrick

For Cobb the votes were F. T. Reddy & Wm. A. Sparks

So Gordy Bishop was elected. It appearing to the Court that the said Bishop is a man of honesty, probity and good demeanor.

John M. Garley is unanimously appointed Commissioner of the Revenue in said his parish in this County for the ensuing year.

Samuel Rello is unanimously appointed Commissioner of the Revenue in Halloway parish in this County for the ensuing year.

This day this cause was docketed by consent of parties with the effect of the same on to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by counsel. Holloman, any three of whom may act, lay off and offer by sale and bounds, one third part in value of all the lands of which Robert Moros died, subject to Polly Moros to be held by her for life as done in the lands of her deceased husband. And the Court doth further direct that James B. Worcester, who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, sell the lands of which Robert Moros died, so far as encumbered by deed of trust to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months, take bond and security of the purchasers for the purchase money, make a deed to the purchaser. And the said Commissioners are required to report their proceedings in an order to a final decree.
