This day this cause was debated by laws of Court and consent of parties and came on to be heard and
 told and answer and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth order as follows
 doover that John Edwards and Benjamin Pope be appointed commissioners of the Court that they
 divide the negroes belonging to the estate of St. Robert T. Musgrave into three lots and being sold to
 value, and allot one of said slaves to Robert T. Musgrave Jr. who is now dead - that said Benjamin
 then sell to the highest bidder said slaves upon the following terms after giving discharge of the same and
 place of sale - they are to remain on the day of sale as each money enough to pay the costs of the same
 and for the balance they are to take six loads - one for two months of the whole and assign the same
 to Mrs Charlotte Leigh in her own right, one for the same amount and assign to the guardian
 of George Musgrave - one for the same amount and assign to the guardian of Sarah Musgrave
 One for one month and assign to the guardian of William Leigh - one for the same amount and
 assign to the guardian of Mary A. Leigh and one other bond for same amount and assign
 the guardian of Richard Leigh - And report to the Court on order to a final decree.

The Commissioner on this court this day made the following report: "Accordingly to an order
 of the Worshipful Court of Southampton. in the Commissioners have proceeded to divide the
 lands of Thomas Fitzhugh dec'd as follows. Lot A. 1. containing 75 acres with the mansion
 house and other improvements to John Taylor Fitzhugh, beginning at an oak corner for
 Drew Fitzhugh and John T. Fitzhugh in Wendalls line, thence east along the said Wendalls
 line to a pine, a corner in Charlotte Bygones line, thence north along the said Charlotte Bygones line to a
 gum on Stollings river, thence a straight line to the oak at the beginning. Lot A. 2. 200 acres
 Drew Fitzhugh, beginning at the oak aforesaid, thence east along the said Wendalls line to a pine, corner
 for Drew Fitzhugh and Thomas Fitzhugh in Wendalls line, thence north, a straight line to Stollings
 river, thence down the said river to John T. Fitzhugh's line, thence up the said line to oak at the begin-
 ning. Lot A. 3. 252 acres to Thomas Fitzhugh, beginning at the aforesaid line a corner to
 Drew and Thomas Fitzhugh, thence West along the said Wendalls line to the Buckhorn Swamp and
 Archdens will, thence down the said Swamp to Stollings River, thence down the said river to
 Drew Fitzhugh's line, thence South along the said line to the pine at the beginning.
 On the north side of Stollings river Lot A. 4. 54 acres to Drew Fitzhugh beginning at a straight
 river at a point gum in Samuel T. James' line, thence along the said James' line to a maple
 corner Edwin Sommers and Drew Fitzhugh in James' line, thence east along the said Edwin Sommers
 line to a black gum across for Drew Fitzhugh and Thomas Fitzhugh in Edwin Sommers' line
 thence South a straight line to a horn beam on said River, thence up the said river to the gum at the
 beginning. Lot A. 5. 150 acres to Thomas Fitzhugh beginning at the aforesaid corner black
 gum in Edwin Sommers' line, thence along the said Sommers' line to a point oak corner for
 Edwin Sommers and John Little, thence along Little's line to a pear-tree gum, a corner in said
 Little's line for John Fitzhugh and John T. Fitzhugh, thence South a straight line to a point oak
 corner in said river aforesaid, thence up the said river to the horn beam in Drew Fitzhugh's line
 thence along the said Fitzhugh's line to the black gum at the beginning.
