This day this cause was docketed by Court and consent of parties and came on to be heard and
brought and argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth order adjudgme-
dence that Peter Edwards and Benjamin P. Jr. be appointed Commissioners of the Court, that they
divide the negroes belonging to the estate of St. Robert J. Musgrave into three lots and assign them to
value, and allot one of said slaves to Robert J. Musgrave Jr. who is now dead - shall said Commissioners
then sell to the highest bidder said slaves upon the following terms after giving due notice of the time and
place of sale - they are to receive on the day of sale as cash money enough to pay the cost of the same
and for the balance they are to take six bonds, one for the sum of the whole and assign the same
to Mrs. Charlotte Leigh in her own right, one for the same amount and assign to the guardian
of George Musgrave, one for the same amount and assign to the guardians of Sarah Musgrave
one for one month and assign to the guardian of William Leigh, one for the same amount and
assign to the guardian of Mary A. Leigh and one other bond for same amount and assign
the guardian of Richard Leigh - And report to the Court in order to a final decree.

The Commissioners on this court this day made the following report: "A generally to an act
of the Worshipful Court of Southwicks, in the County of Gloucester have proceeded to divide the
lands of Thomas Folburgh see as follows. Lot A. 1. containing 75 acres with the manor
house and other improvements to John Taylor Folburgh, beginning at an oak on corner of
Dow Folburgh and John J. Folburgh in Bowdalls line, thence east along the said Bowdalls
line to a fence, a corner in Charlotte Bryant's line, thence north along the said Charlotte Bryant's line
unto on Nettway river, thence a straight line to the rock at the beginning. Lot A. 2. 278 acres
to Dow Folburgh, beginning at the rock aforesaid, thence east along the said Bowdalls line to a fence, now
for Dow Folburgh and Thomas Folburgh in Bowdalls line, thence north a straight line to Nettway
river, thence down the said river to John J. Folburgh's line, thence up the said line to the beginning.
Lot A. 3. 252 acres to Thomas Folburgh, beginning at the aforesaid line a corner to
Dow and Thomas Folburgh, thence West along the said Bowdalls line to the Bowdalls branch and
Ackleton's mill, thence down the said stream to Nettway River, thence down the said river to
Dow Folburgh's line, thence South along the said line to the point at the beginning.
On the north side of Nettway river Lot A. 4. 56 acres to Dow Folburgh beginning at Nettway
river at a point just in Samuel J. James' line, thence along the said James' line to a point a
corner Edwin Simmons and Dow Folburgh in James' line, thence east along the said stream
line to a black goat a corner for Dow Folburgh and Thomas Folburgh in Edwin Simmons' line
thence back a straight line to a horn beam on said River, thence up said river to the point at the
beginning. Lot A. 2. 150 acres to Thomas Folburgh beginning at the aforesaid point back
unto a black goat a corner in Edwin Simmons' line, thence along the said Simmons' line to a point on
Edwin Simmons' and John Little's line, thence along Little's line to a fence from a corner in said
Little's line for Dow Folburgh and Dow J. Folburgh, thence south a straight line to a fence in said
river aforesaid, thence up the said river to the horn beam in Dow Folburgh's line
to it along the said Folburgh's line to the black goat at the beginning."
