 the remaining fifth which he shall assign to James Morrell in right of his wife Hannah formerly
 Williams, in lieu of her dower in the said land, and for the balance of said fifth he take a bond
 payable as aforesaid, and assign the same to the guardians at law of Selia Williams, and report to
 this Court in order for a final decree.

 Susan Lamb, So. A. Davis and Jane his wife, Viderey Simmons & Eveline his wife
 Nathaniel, Sarah, Rebecca, John, Susan, & William B. Lamb by L. R. Edwards their
 guardian ad litem Defts.

This day this cause came on to be heard by consent on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel
 On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that O. W. Hapsburg who is hereby
 appointed a Special Commissioner of this Court, after advertising the time and place of sale for thirty
 days at the Courthouse and at two or more public places in the County, proceed to sell to the highest
 bidder the said slave in the bill mentioned, and that he reserve so much in cash as will defray
 the expenses of this decree, that he take a bond payable twelve months after date for one sixth
 part of the balance of the proceeds of sale which he shall assign to the widow Susan Lamb
 in lieu of her dower in said slave, and for the remainder take eight equal bonds payable twelve
 months after date, and that he assign one to Joseph Davis in right of his wife Jane, one to Viderey
 Simmons in right of his wife Eveline and the other six to the guardians at law severally of Theodore,
 Nathaniel, Sarah, Rebecca, John, Susan, and William B. Lamb and report to this Court in order
 to a final decree.

On the motion of James Maget against James Clayton Committed, Willis Coley a bond for
 Counter Security. This day came as well the said Maget as the said Clayton in their proper persons who
 being fully heard it is considered by the Court that the said Clayton give the said Maget good counter secu-
 rity the bond for which purpose is to be in the penalty of ten thousand dollars, made payable to the said
 James Maget and conditioned according to law, and that the said James Clayton do also pay the costs of this motion,
 whereupon the said James Clayton together with
 Allen Edwards and James Bradshaw his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond according
 to the above order.

A list of insolvent revenue tax for the year 1846 was returned by James D. Hapsburg
 deputy of Benjamin B. Hines Sheriff of this County, sworn to by the said James D. Hapsburg, examined
 and allowed by the Court and ordered to be certified to the Auditor of Public accounts.

On the motion of Martha Pope. Ordered that she be exempt from the payment of Taxes &
 levies for her two slaves Selah & Cherry in future shipping aged and infirm.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent moneys in his hands not otherwise
 appropriated pay to Jordan Edwards & Stevenson Joyner each ten dollars for procuring

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the Overseers of the poor bind Ben
 Brailhook and Ephraim and Selas free negro boys to Richard A. Grump according to
 law and that the said Grump pay for the services of the said apprentices as follows
 For Ben Brailhook ten dollars annually, for Ephraim seven dollars annually
