This day this cause came on to be heard by consent on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel
on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that E. W. Mapenburg who is hereby
appointed a Special Commissioner of this Court after advertising the time and place of sale for thirty
days at the Courthouse and at two or more public places in the County, proceed to sell to the highest
bidder the said Slave in the bill mentioned, and that he reserve so much in cash as will defray
the expenses of this decree that he takes a bond payable twelve months after date for our said
part of the balance of the proceeds of sale which he shall assign to the widow Susan Lamb
in lieu of her dower in said slave and for the remainder take eight equal bonds payable twelve
months after date, and that he assign one to Joseph Davis in right of his wife Jane, one to Vilderoy
Simmons in right of his wife Eveline and the other six to the guardians at law severally of Theodore,
Katherine, Sarah, Rebecca, John, Susan, and William B. Lamb and report to this Court in order
to a final decree.

On the motion of James Magat against James Clayton Committee of Willis City a sum of
counter security. This day came as well the said Magat as the said Clayton in their proper persons who
being fully heard it is considered by the Court that the said Clayton give the said Magat good counter security
the bond for which purpose is to be in the penalty of ten thousand dollars, made payable to the said
James Magat and conditioned according to law. and that the said James Clayton do pay from his estate of this amount
Allan Edwards and James Bradshaw his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond security
to the above order.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the Overseers of the poor bind Ben
Bartholomew and Ephraim and Silas free negro boys to Richard A. Crump according to
law and that the said Crump pay for the services of the said apprentices as follows.
For Ben Bartholomew ten dollars annually for Ephraim seven dollars annually
