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Said Miller having made complaint to a Justice of the Peace for this County that Henry Miller his attorney
was removing out of this County personally or to procure a writ to himself that the ordinary process of law could not
be served upon him, and the said Justice having granted an attachment against the estate of the said Henry
Miller returnable to this Court, which has been laid upon sundry goods and chattels. The said Levi Waller
this day appeared by his attorney and the said Henry Miller being solemnly called before me. Whereupon
came James H. Abbott Coroner who claimed the property laid upon, and the said Levi Waller and the
said James H. Abbott Coroner afterwards being fully heard. It is concluded by the Court that the plaintiff
recover against the defendant the sum of two dollars with interest from the 7 day of January 1847 till paid
and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the defendant do the
said attachment after selling and the return of the goods and chattels attached at respondent and satisfy
the Court's judgment this day rendered upon attachment in favour of B. G. H. P. P. O. D. Boston.
Benjamin C. Miller, Benjamin C. Rice, James H. P. P. O. D. Boston, that satisfy the balance on
satisfaction of this judgment and if any surplus should then remain return it to the defendant. That
the said officer is required to return to the Clerk's Office within thirty days after the said sale a receipt
and completed an account of the sale, specifying thereon the several articles sold, the prices to whom sold
and the price thereof.
It is so ordered. So the judgment given for the plaintiff on the said motion the said James H. Abbott
Coroner as aforesaid accepted and returned his bill of response, which bill was issued, signed & sealed
by the Court and ordered to be made a part of the record in this case.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next term.
