Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County & the first day of the  
next term to recommend other fit and proper persons to be added to the Commission of the Poor  
of this County.

Ordered that the estate of James Turner die be committed to the hands of Jack Burns Esq.  
of this County for administration according to law.
