Whitehead three of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded as and for the last will and testament of said James Massey dec^d. And on the motion of John V. Davis the executor thereof named who would oath and together with David Sumpter, James Bullock and J. P. Massey his executor entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs and is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting justices of this County to the first day of the next Term to recommend other fit and proper persons to be added to the Commission of the Peace for this County.

Ordered that the estate of James Turner dec^d be committed to the hands of Arch. Davis Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.
