On the motion of Henry J. Smith who made oath and together with it Robert F. J. Mahone and Abram Reddick has securities entered into and acknowledged in the sum of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, with respect to his bond for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Lewis H. Bishop dec'd in due form.
