

Isaac Barnes who has been confirmed Sheriff of this County by a commission from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 26th day of January 1847 this day appeared in Court and together with Benjamin O. Pipe, Garrison P. Pipe, James D. Mapesbury, John & Reale and Elizabeth Wardlaw his securities entered into and acknowledged their several bonds in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars each, and delivered with law documents which bonds are ordered to be recorded. the said Barnes also took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath against swearing and the oath of Office.

An Account of Willis Woodburne's guardianship of Jason Woodburne was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the Coronor appropriate One hundred and twenty five dollars out of the estate of Drury towards the support of the wife and children of the said Drury Biddle.

On the motion of William Sykes Ordered that Edward & Harrison guardians of Lucy L. East pay to said William O. Sykes the sum of \$12.50 the amount of the account found to be just.

On the motion of Jacob Barnes Sheriff of this County James D. Mapesbury Garrison P. Pipe, William A. Bell, William Mayot and John Barbare are permitted to qualify as his deputies during pleasure, it appearing to the Court that the said Mapesbury Pipe Bell Mayot and Barbare are men of honesty, probity and good character. Whereupon they took the oaths required by law.

For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that the Coronor as administrator of Drury Biddle who was guardian of Robert Biddle pay over to Mrs. Biddle fifty dollars due her for the support &c of the said Robert Biddle.

The last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Weller was proved by the oaths of Celestine Gardner and George W. Lawrence the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Fred H. Bishop, John D. Bishop and Miles Turner being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appear and all the personal estate of Louis H. Bishop dec'd and return the appurtenances under their hands to Court.

For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that James D. Bishbroske be appointed Trustee in a deed executed by Anthony Williams to Caroline & Williams bearing date the 1st day of February 1842 and directed to record in the Clerk's Office of this Court on the same day -
