

Said Barnes who has been commissioned Sheriff of this County by a Commission from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 30th day of January 1847 this day appeared in Court and together with Benjamin O. Pope, Harrison P. Pope, James D. Hapfening, John B. Hale and Gilbert M. Packard has securities entered into and acknowledged their several bonds in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars each, on delivery as the law directs which bonds are ordered to be recorded. The said Barnes also took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath against selling and the oath of Office.

An Account of Willis Wendeborn guardianship of Susan Wendeborn was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the Governor appropriate One hundred and twenty five dollars out of the estate of Henry Wells towards the support of the wife and children of this said Henry Wells.

On the motion of William Lykes Ordered that Edward L. Parsons guardian of Henry Wells pay to said William D. Lykes the sum of \$12.63 the amount of his account found to be just.

On the motion of said Barnes Sheriff of this County James D. Hapfening, Harrison P. Pope, William A. Bell, William Mayot and John Berhane are permitted to qualify as his deputies during pleasure, it appearing to the Court that the said Hapfening, Pope, Bell, Mayot and Berhane are men of honesty, probity and good conduct. Whereupon they took the several oaths prescribed by law.

For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that the Governor as administrator of Henry Wells who was guardian of Richard Wells pay over to said Wells fifty dollars due him for the support &c of the said Richard Wells.

The last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Wells deceased was proved by the oath of Abner Dardner and George W. Lawrence the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that John A. Bishop, John D. Bishop and Mills Sumner being first duly sworn before as Justices of the peace for that purpose do appear at all the personal estate of Lewis W. Bishop dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that James D. Westbrook be appointed trustee in a deed executed by Anthony Williams to David C. Williams bearing date the 1st day of February 1842 and admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of this Court on the same day.
