For Howell Harris, William A. Davis, Thomas J. Turner, James E. Peters, Nathaniel Francis & John J. P. Pennington the Court were unanimously.

For Peter J. Holmes, Samuel B. Kelle, William A. Summerville, Andrew G. Griffin, John Cobb, William J. Seabell, and Jonathan Dardow the Court were unanimously.

The Court then proceeded to take the vote between Henry Kendrick, Merit J. Davis, Nathan B. Bryant and Elijah Ingers, which two of them should be recommended and the vote stood as follows:

For Henry Kendrick the votes were G. A. W. Newsum, Robert G. Griffin, Francis T. Ridley, Nicholas, Samuel Downey, Jacob Barrett, Benj. C. Pope, Alexander Myrick, Samuel P. Archibald, and James Magot.

For Merit J. Davis the votes were G. A. W. Newsum, Robert G. Griffin, A. Myrick, & J. P. Parker.

For Nathan B. Bryant the votes were Nicholas, A. M. Seabell, Samuel Downey, Benj. C. Pope, James D. Bryant, and Thomas D. Wood.

For Elijah Ingers the votes were F. T. Ridley, William D. Hood, Thomas Ridley, A. M. Seabell, Jacob Barrett, James D. Bryant, J. P. Parker, Thomas D. Wood, and James Magot. Henry Kendrick having a majority, the Court proceeded to take which of these three should be recommended, and the vote stood as follows:

For Merit J. Davis the votes were G. A. W. Newsum, Robert G. Griffin, and Alexander Myrick.

For Nathan B. Bryant the votes were Thomas Ridley, W. Archibald, A. M. Seabell, Samuel Downey, Jacob Barrett, Benj. C. Pope, and James D. Bryant.

For Elijah Ingers the votes were F. T. Ridley, William D. Hood, J. P. Parker, Thomas D. Wood, Nicholas, and James Magot.

The Court then proceeded to take the vote between Richard Barrett, William A. Maysburg, Seth D. Williams, and Abner Gardner, which two of them should be recommended - the vote stood as follows:

For Richard Barrett the votes were George A. W. Newsum, Thomas Ridley, Francis T. Ridley, William D. Hood, Nicholas M. Seabell, Samuel Downey, Benjamin C. Pope, Alexander Myrick, J. P. Parker, James D. Bryant, Thomas D. Wood, and Nicholas.

For William A. Maysburg the votes were G. A. W. Newsum, Francis T. Ridley, Thomas Ridley, Robert G. Griffin, William D. Hood, Nicholas, A. M. Seabell, Samuel Downey, Benj. C. Pope, Alexander Myrick, James D. Bryant, J. P. Parker, Thomas D. Wood, and James Magot.

For Seth D. Williams the votes were Robert G. Griffin, J. P. Parker, James Magot, Jacob Barrett, Howell Harris, William A. Davis, Thomas J. Turner, James E. Peters, Nathaniel Francis, John J. P. Pennington, Peter J. Holmes, Samuel B. Kelle, William A. Summerville, Andrew G. Griffin, John Cobb, William J. Seabell, Jonathan Dardow, Henry Kendrick, Nathan B. Bryant, Richard Barrett, and William A. Maysburg are recommended to the Governor of this Commonwealth as fit and proper persons to be commissioned Justices of the Peace for this County.

Ordered that Thomas D. Wood, Henry Peters and Richard Dardow, any two of whom may act as the lowest undertaker, the repairs of the Cypress bridge, within the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
