

February 1847, after having advertised the same twenty days, to sell the slaves mentioned in the bill of sale to the highest bidder, on a credit of nine months, when the guardian Emma Branch became the purchaser, for the sum of \$1427.76 and after deducting the costs and expenses of the same amounting to fifty five dollars and sixty nine cents (\$55.69) allotted to the widow Emma Branch, one fourth part, or \$353.01 $\frac{1}{2}$ and to her also, as guardian to Martha A Williams 1/4 part, leaving Martha A Williams indebted to her, when the account of sales shall be in demand, say 27th of November 1847 \$16.25 to her as guardian of Sally Bush 1/4 part leaving the ward at the same time indebted to her, as guardian \$131.55 $\frac{1}{2}$ And to as guardian of Francis McBranch the 1/4 part (\$348.01 $\frac{1}{2}$) which will leave her indebted to the ward, at that time, 27th November 1847, \$8.25 which is respectfully submitted - March 18. 1847.
