The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report which is as follows:

"To the hon. Court of Chancery of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts by your honored body to appertain to the widow of William C. Williams, deceased, in the negro and land of the said dec'd, by leave to report, that they did on the 29th December 1856 at the residence of Wm. H. Garrison, dec'd, proceed to divide the negroes according to the following valuation to wit:

Dick \$500. Dary \$200. Marion \$200. Mason \$200. Henry \$300. Nicholas \$150. Clements \$150. Barberough \$200. making an aggregate of \$1,200. To the negro widow so however appertained Dary, Marion and Nicholas whose aggregate value is one thousand and twenty five dollars, being one and exceeding her lawful portion by the sum of eight dollars and 50/100 which amount will be deducted from above named no appertaining to Lelew Williams only daughter of the aforesaid Wm. C. Williams dec'd. The Commissioners in further prosecution of your orders did on the 15th day of May 1857 meet at the residence of William C. Williams dec'd and proceeded to set apart the widow's share in the landed estate of aforesaid Wm. C. Williams dec'd, commencing at the great gate in front of the dwelling house, thence along the wood fence to the first station branch, thence up the back Roads to a white oak, thence to a sycamore tree to a decayed fence, in the open field, thence due west across the open field to a black oak, thence to the old field fence to Davis Bryant's line, thence along the said Bryant's line to the public road, thence down said road to Davis Lane fence, thence along said fence to the first named station. Given under my hands the 22nd day of April 1857, as Commissioners. W. Davis.

An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Francis P. Bulle dec'd was returned and ordered to be recorded.
