Bachman his associates entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted them for drawing letters of administration on the estate of Jacob D. Bryant dec'd in due form.

Or ordered that Joseph H. Bachman, Thomas Reddy, George W. Gray, and Benjamin Applewhite or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Jacob D. Bryant dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to Clerk.

At the motion of William Judkins. Ordered that one of the Commissioners of this Court do state what and adjust an account of said Judkins' administration on the estate of George A. Bachman dec'd and make report thereof to Court.

This day this cause was docketed by consent of parties and came on to be heard on the bill and answered and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and direct that William Evans and Samson J. Westbroek, who are appointed Commissioners for that purpose do sell to the highest bidder for each the negro woman Rachel and three children in the bill mentioned and out of the proceeds first pay the cost of this suit, the balance they divide into four equal parts and assign one fourth to William Evans in right of his wife Martha, one fourth part to said Evans as purchaser from James Phipps, one fourth to be divided into four equal parts and assign one to Samuel J. Westbroek in right of his wife Nancy, one to William A. Williamson in right of his wife Elizabeth, one to Edwin Claude, one to William Evans as purchaser of David Stevens, and the other fourth part to be divided into four equal parts and assign one fourth to Ben. A. Phipps, the remaining two sevenths John Drury as guardian to Robert, Edwin, Ann, John, Robert & Joseph Phipps, and make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

A Deed of bargain and sale from Thomas Branch to John J. Donahue was produced in Court and Henry H. Gray, John Conner and Joseph J. Tolles being several deponents say that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Thomas Branch and only believe that the signature of the said Thomas Branch and worthy belief that the said Donahue to the said deed is in the proper handwriting of the said Thomas Branch. Whereupon it is ordered that the said deed be recorded.

Ordered that Richard H. Donahue, Col. Lyman, and Brown Griffis do let to the local undertaker the (cost of undertaking the expenses of embalming) of little search bridge, over the dam when completed and make report to Court.
