Esopus Spry for wilfully and unlawfully shooting and thereby causing the death of an innocent  
to Mrs Emma Daniels sometime in the last of July 1847 in the County of Southampton and  
voluntary evidence of Edward A Williams bricklayer of the County of Southampton.  
And the said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

The Commissioners appointed to sell and assign to Horatio A Gardner in right of his wife wife  
in value of the slaves whom William H Harmon did profess this day made their report which  
follows. "We the Commissioners appointed according to the judgment order to sell to Horatio  
Gardner in right of his wife Susanna Ann Harmon one fifth of the slaves whom her father  
William H Harmon did profess to be his to expect that in value the slaves of the same  
at Seventy nine hundred and ninety six dollars and 80c and assigned to the said Horatio  
Gardner in right of his wife Susanna Ann one negro woman Barbara and child valued at 12  
hundred dollars being the sum of Seventy cents more than said Gardner professed  
said amount of Seventy cents he the said Gardner will pay over to the grand jury of the  
other legatees. Done in under our hands this 10<sup>th</sup> day of July 1847. Attest & Seal  
C. C. Abbott and Horatio Gardner Commissioners".

On the motion of William D Pope who made oath and together with John Parker and  
Richard M. Carr his Sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One  
hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for allowing time of  
administration on the estate of Robina Pope deceased on due form.

The Court doth adjudge A. S. H. Burgess guardian to his infant child Mary Anna Rogers  
thereupon he together with Thomas J. Trotter his Surety entered into and acknowledged  
in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

Samuel Kells a general guardian to Henry Gardner infant son of Joseph Gardner and  
he together with A. S. H. Burgess and Arthur A. Dewey his Sureties entered into and acknowledged  
a bond in the penalty of four hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

On the motion of Eliza Brown, f. n. Ordered that Benjamin & Dick L. Simons  
the first day of the next Term to show cause, if any he can why the Indenture made between  
and Rachell children of the said Ballott should not be recorded.
