An account of Robert Daughlings guardianship of Caroline D. Daughling was returned and ordered to be recorded.

This day this cause came on to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by counsel. On consideration thereof the Court with order adjudge and decree that William R. Jones do append a Commission of the Court, and that he be authorized after giving the value of the same and place of sale, to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, the tract of land late in the possession of James Gardner known by the name of the pring woods to sit containing about forty six acres, upon a credit of two months, except for so much as may be necessary to pay the costs of this decree which have to remain on each. For the balance he is to take four bonds of equal amounts with good and sufficient security and assign one to Elly Gardner, one to Correll Gardner, one to James R. Gardner, one to Anna Gardner and the third to the guardian ad litem of Caroline D. Daughling and report to the Court on order to a final decree.

Ordered that the estate of Joseph S. Nickerson dec^d be committed to the hands of Jacob Bunn Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that James W. Hanes children of Anne Chapman free negro be bound to Henry P. Briggs by the Overseers of the Poor according to law, his paying for the services of said children \$20 each annually until their arrival at age.

On the petition of Thomas S. Barber and others for leave to open a new road from the plantation of Thomas S. Barber to the plantation of Jacoby Griffins. It is ordered that William D. Bradshaw, William R. Stephenson, Cephaed Turner & A. B. Barges or any three of them being sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose, do view the ground along which said road is proposed to be conducted and report to the Court the convenience and inconvenience that will result as well to individuals as to the public in case the said road be opened as proposed.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the able Justice of this County to the first day of the next Term to appear an attorney to present on behalf of the Commonwealth on this Court.

On the motion of Joseph T. Liles. Ordered that Commissioner Goodings do take, take and adjust an account of said Liles administration on the estate of George Beeth dec^d and make report to the Court.
