On the motion of John M. Barber who made oath and together with Charles D. Hovey and Joseph M. Barber his Executors entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs to be performed as guaranties him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William C. Parker dec'd in due form.

Ordered that James D. Hopfensberg, John Hovey Jr, Richard Parker and Warren Edwards or any three of them, being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of William C. Parker dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Bishop a good and lawful deed for the same with special warranty, and make report to Court of their proceedings.
