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For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the order this day made allowing John Davis out of the principal of his bonds estate to refund an amount sufficient to pay for the laundry clothes of his wards, the options of James C. Harman be void the same being awarded.

On the petition of Edwin Turner a descendant of a female of the Abington tribe of Indians she ordered that the trustees of the said tribe be summoned to the next Court to show cause if any they are why the said Edwin Turner portion of the lands and funds of the said tribe should not be set apart and allotted to him.

The Court with officer Robert S. Goffen quashed to his infant son John Edwin Goffen and thenceforth he together with Frederick H. Goffen and William B. Goffen his brothers entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

On motion of James D. Boycott. Ordered that Stephen F. Edwards also a bondswoman Special Commissioner for the purpose do state settle and adjust an account of said Boycott's administration in the estate of Daisy Boycott dec. and make report thereof to Court.

Benjamin Davis late of the County of Southampton who stands charged with being feloniously shot Joel Vick jr. with a shot gun in the left thigh with intention to kill him, appeared in Court on discharge of his recognizance, and was set to the bar on reading the Sheriff of this County. Whereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and before by the Council fully heard. The Court after hearing the evidence and from all the evidence of the case of the case are of opinion that the said Benjamin Davis ought not to be prosecuted for the offences aforesaid for which he stands charged. And forasmuch as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from custody.

On the motion of Willis A. Lee for negro, Ordered that the Clerk provide to said child a new copy of his register. It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the former copy had been actually lost or destroyed.

Ordered that the following proceedings of the Justices of the County do be read and that of the Court be entered upon the records of this Court to wit.

The sudden and melancholy death of Carl William C. Parker late prosecuting attorney at Court having been communicated to the Court by Robert B. Kelley Esq. on motion. Resolved that the Court entertaining a deep sense of the great merits of said Carl as a prosecuting attorney as a citizen and a man displayed in all the relations of life and in a long career of official services, profoundly regretting his life and wishing to manifest respect for his memory in an enduring form, order that these proceedings be entered upon the minutes of the Court.

Resolved that we will wear the badge of mourning for thirty days.

Resolved that a copy of these proceedings be communicated to the family of the deceased and to the Richmond Inquirer The Richmond Whig, the Petersburg Intelligencer and the Raleigh Republican.
