Herring who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner of this Court, after advertising the time & place of sale for twenty days at the Court house and at two or more public places in the vicinity of the land mentioned in the bill, proceed to sell the said land subject to the widest right of dower to the highest bidder and that he receive so much in cash as will pay the expenses of this decree, and for the balance of the proceeds of sale he take equal bonds payable in nine months with good security, that he return one himself, assign one to James R. and one to Martha S. Herring, that he assign five of the said bonds to the guardian at law of Charles R. Lee, D. Asst. & James Herring, and that he assign the remaining one to the guardian at law of Wiley & Ann Blye D. W. and report to this Court in order to a final decree.
