The Committee in this case this day made a report which is in this record book. According to an interlocutory decree, Gardner's heirs or Gardner, pronounced the 25th day of September 1847 by Schenectady County Court, your Committee having advertised the time and place of sale of the tract of land in the hill mentioned, late in the property of James Gardner, so known as the "spiny woods tract" containing forty six acres more or less, by several advertisements which were posted up, at the most public places, fifteen days previous to the day of sale, proceeded on Saturday the 9th day of October 1847 and in the forenoon sold the same to the highest bidder on a roll of six numbers (except the sum sufficient to defray the expenses of the sale \$7) when Everett Gardner became the last bidder for the sum of \$100.58
