The Commission in this cause this day made a report which is on this words to wit: "And whereas
an interlocutory decree Gardner vs Gardner pronounced the 28 day of September 1847 by
Southampton County Court, gave Commission having advertised the time and place of sale of
the tract of land, on the 11th month, 1847, late in the possession of James Gardner do known as the
"spring woods tract" containing forty six acres more or less, by several advertisements which were
posted up, at the most public places, fifteen days previous to the day of sale, proceeded on selling
the 9th day of October 1847 and on the premises sold the same to the highest bidder on a credit of
six months (except the same sufficient to defray the expenses of the sale &c) when Everett Gardner
became the last bidder for the same of

Ever Gardner then deducted \$10 the other fee & \$3.35 the Clerk fee & \$15 the
Commission on the sales making

Ever Gardner then took five separate bonds executed by Everett Gardner with
Charles Holland & Joseph Dandall his securities for \$100 each payable to the
parties as by said decree directed, which accounts for the purchase money aforesaid

Ever Gardner then delivered to Sally Gardner one of said bonds for	\$16.60
one dollar to Everett Gardner for	16.60
one dollar - James R. Gardner -	16.60
one dollar - Ann Gardner -	16.60
One dollar - Robt. Daugherty Grand for bond	16.60
