This day this cause came on to be heard on the bill of the plaintiff, depositions, exhibits filed and the answer of the defendant Arthur Gardner and the infant defendant Martha Gardner by Sarah Manry her guardian ad litem and was argued by Counsel. Upon the hearing whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that John M. Gurley be appointed a Special Commissioner to sell the tract of land lying near Cypress bridge whereof William Gardner deceased say'd and possessed, containing by estimation 100 acres of land that the said John M. Gurley after having given due notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement at the courthouse door of this County and other public places proceed to sell the said tract of land at public auction to the highest bidder for enough in cash to defray the expenses of this decree, and the balance of the purchase money on a credit of one and two years, the purchasers giving bonds with approved security for the purchase money, and a lien to be retained upon the land until all the purchase money shall have been paid. But no sale is to be made under this decree until the guardian of Martha Gardner shall have executed a bond with sufficient security in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia with a condition to invest the money arising from the sale of the land as fast as it shall come to hand by lending it out, taking bonds with good security and make report to the Court in order to a final decree -

On the motion of Joseph Pritchett who made affirmation and together with Robert J. Doctor & Israel Pritchett his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Mary Pritchett deceased in due form -

The last Will and Testament of Fanny Martin deceased was proved by the oath of Benjamin E. Daugherty and Benjamin C. Barn the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded

Ordered that the estate of Joseph M. Faircloth deceased be committed to the hands of Jacob Barnes Sheriff of this County for administration according to law -

For reasons appearing to the Court. It is ordered that the Overseers of the Poor do bind Martha Cornwell, negro, to William M. Everett according to law, be paying the sum of five dollars per annum until she arrives to 21 years of age -
