At the Court house of the County of Southampton on the 22^d day of January 1849, Edmund P. Kirkshaw Esq. & J. A. W. Newgate Justices of the County informed, attended and constituted a Court for the trial of a complaint of Richard Darder against John A. Darder for unlawfully holding him out of possession of a certain tenement containing four acres of land with its appurtenances lying and being in the County. Whereupon it appearing that the defendant has been duly served with the summons, the court proceeded to impanel a jury for the trial of the complaint and William Sargeant Esq. D. Deale, Lewis Howell, Harrison & Moore, Mr. Cobb, Richard M. East, John Stephenson, C. C. Grumpler, Merriweather Holland, Dennis Barrett, Asbury Vick and Lawrence Poffe having been accordingly impaneled, they were charged on oath in the manner prescribed by the Statute and the Justices admitted before them all legal evidence which was offered as well as the part of the defendant as on the part of the plaintiff and suffered each party to have by Counsel. And the said Jury after hearing the evidence and the arguments of Counsel unanimously agreed upon a verdict and found the same in the following words to be: "We the jury find that the defendant did not at the time of institution of the complaint filed in this cause hold possession of the premises mentioned against the consent of the plaintiff. And the defendant hath not so held possession thereof against the consent of the plaintiff for three years next before the institution of the said complaint, and that the plaintiff hath the right of possession in the tenement aforesaid." Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the said Complaint be rejected and that the defendant recover against the plaintiff his costs by him on this behalf expended -
