for the forthcoming on the day of sale of property taken under execution.  
This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant  
had had legal notice of this action they were solemnly called but came not. Whereupon the  
execution and bond aforesaid being produced and inspected it is considered by the Court that the  
plaintiff may have a cause against the defendants for One hundred and four dollars forty  
four cents, the penalty of the said bond and his costs by him about due and on this behalf it is ordered  
that the said Defendants pay Henry C. Willing & Co. But this judgment is to be discharged by the sum  
of fifty two dollars and twenty two cents with legal interest thereon from the 15 day of October  
1857 till paid and the costs.

The Court doth adjudge Lucy Dow guardian to Dennis Minnifield, Amst. Edward J.  
Roxana and Priscilla Drew espouse of Stephen Dow deceased, and therefore doth direct  
Lucy Dow with Henry C. Willing and William H. Holloman her tenants  
entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according  
to law.

Nicholas Bryant and John York, of Ithaca, appeared in Court and being sworn testified  
that Louisa Gray wife of Richard G. Gray was and is the only child and heir of Ephraim  
Bryant who was a soldier in the last war and died in the service at Fort Norfolk.  
that the said Louisa Gray has resided in the County of Southampton, Virginia for the last  
twenty five years and now resides in the same County. The said Nicholas Bryant further  
testified that if any certificate of pension has ever been issued it has been lost or surrendered  
by him who was her guardian. Which fact evidence is ordered to be certified.

Court. And report to this Court in order to a final decree.

The Commissioner appointed to view the way for opening a road from Peter's Hill to the  
Mill road this day made a report which is in these words "For the sake of the public  
order, in the opinion of the commissioners have proceeded to view the road leading from Peter's Hill to  
Peter's Mill road and have unanimously agreed that the road shall run near the  
line of the hill and when put in proper order agreeable to law of which respectfully submit  
to your Worship's whether it shall be put in order at the Commissary's expense or cost. The Plff  
is of opinion that no inconvenience will result to any person by the alteration proposed."
