 execution and bond aforesaid being produced and inspected it is considered by the Court that the
 plaintiff may have execution against the defendants for One hundred and four dollars forty
 four cents, the penalty of the said bond and his costs by him about his said writs and writs of habeas
 corpus and the said Defendants on offering \$50. But this judgment is to be discharged by the payment
 of fifty two dollars and twenty two cents with legal interest thereon from the 15th day of September
 1867 till paid and the costs.

 to law.

 that Simon Gray wife of Richard B. Gray was and is the only child and heir of Ephraim
 Doynt who was a soldier in the last War and died in the service at Fort Knappa
 that the said Simon Gray has resided in the County of Southampton, Virginia for the last
 twenty five years and now resides in the same County. The said Nicholas Doynt further
 testifies that if any certificate of pension has ever been issued it has been lost or destroyed
 by him who was her guardian. Which said evidence is ordered to be accepted.
