On the motion of William S. Seabell who made oath and together with James H. Seabell, James Peck and John James his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of eight thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs conformable to a grant made him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Daniel H. Drayton deceased in due form.

Ordered that J. A. W. Newman, F. S. Mahon, James H. Seabell and J. S. Williams or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Daniel H. Drayton deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Joseph Dwyer Sheriff of this County William S. Seabell Esquire, Edward P. Turner, Anthony M. Norvell, Esq. Drury & Mahon James were appointed his deputies during his absence and thereupon they took the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath against duelling and the oath of office. It appearing to the Court that the said Seabell, Turner, Norvell, Drury & James are men of honesty, probity and good demeanor.

This day the cause came on to be heard by consent of parties on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Lewis Norvell be appointed a Special Comptroller, who after giving due notice of the time and place of Sale shall sell to the highest bidder for cash the negro boy named Eldredge belonging to the estate of Sarah Norvell deceased. And the Court doth further adjudge, order & decree that Lewis Norvell be allowed to expend the sum of fifty dollars for the board & clothing of Martha Norvell and the like sum of fifty dollars for the board and clothing of Pauline Norvell for the year 1858 and the balance of the money arising from the sale of the negro boy Eldredge laid out on goods personal Security for the benefit of the infants Martha, Henry and Pauline J. Norvell.

On motion of Philip J. Coland. Ordered that he be allowed to expend thirty dollars yearly during per annum for five years out of the principal of the estate of Patricia Carr for her support &c.
