

On motion of Edmund D. More, guardian for Edgar, Martha J. Henry & Elizabeth H. Bryant. Ordered that he be allowed to refund ten dollars per annum for the years 1826 & 1827 of the principal of his wards estate for their support &c.

On the motion of James H. Mangum. Ordered that one of the Commissioners of this Court do State, settle and adjust an account of said Mangum's administration on the estate of Barbara Warrum de^d and make report thereof to Court.

On the motion of Meredith Hollands. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies for his negro woman Rachel in future. Rachel being aged and infirm.

On the motion of Simon Murfee. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies in future for his negro man Jacob, he being aged and infirm.

Abram S. Gardner foreman. Joseph S. Davidson, William H. Griffin, Horace Edwards, Henry Foster, Matthew Wells, Samuel Ellis, Richard M. Carr, Mills L. Gray, Margate Holloman, Benjamin B. Keller, William B. Jenkins, William Dimes, Mordecai Bradsher, John Griffin, Eugene Linn, Calum J. Fearbright, Benjamin C. Barnes, Oliver M. Bryant, William C. Myrick and Davis Bryant were sworn a grand jury of inquest for the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented.

Joseph S. Cooper for an assault and battery upon the person of W^m P. Moore farmer, of Southampton County on the 25th day of January 1828. on his own premises in the County of Southampton. This presentment was made upon the voluntary evidence of W^m P. Moore.

John Barshaw and W^m B. Brantley for committing an offence by fighting in public at Jerusalem in the County of Southampton on February Court day upon the evidence of W^m Murfee sent by the Court at our request.

Solomon Barnes, John Beale and Allen Beale for an offence by fighting together in public at Popes Hole in the County of Southampton on the 29th day of December 1827 on the evidence of two of our body Richard M. Carr & Mills L. Gray.

Samuel Vick, James Holt and two free negroes, Cotton Whitehead & Doss White for unlawful gaming on the 16th January 1828 in the County of Southampton on the evidence of Lewis Morrell sworn in Court at the request of the grand jury.

James Vick (living in the neighbourhood of Northhead) for an unlawful assembly of slaves at his house in the County of Southampton within the last twelve months and as a nuisance to the neighbourhood, on the evidence of Henry Blum and Peter Story who were sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury.

Bryant & Holland for an assault and battery on the person of Henry Foster in the County of Southampton on the 25th day of February 1828. upon the evidence of the said Foster one of our body sworn in Court to give evidence.

Richard S. Clements and William B. Brantley for committing an offence by fighting in public at Augustus M. Harle sale in the County of Southampton on the 18th day of January 1828 upon the evidence of John Barshaw who was sent for by the grand jury and sworn in Court to give evidence. And the said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.
