On the motion of James H. Marquess. Ordered that one of the commissioners of the Court de Seize, settle and adjust an account of said Marquess's administration on the estate of Barbara Morris late and make report thereof to court.

On the motion of Meredith Hollands. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies for his negro woman Rachel in future, she being aged and infirm.

On the motion of Simon Murfee. Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies infuture for his negro man Jack, he being aged and infirm.

Abraam J. Gardner foreman Joseph J. Darden, William H. Griffin, Warren Edwards, Henry Fowler, Matthew Hills, Samuel Ellis, Richard M. Carr, Mills L. Gray, Mazyd Holloman, Benjamin L. Haller, William H. Jenkins, William Brown, Horatio Pease, John Griffin, George Lum, Calum J. Scarbrough, Benjamin E. Barnes, Oliver H. Bryant, William E. Myrick and Davis Bryant were sworn a grand jury of inquest for the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented

Joseph G. Cooper for an assault and battery upon the person of W^m P. Moore farmer, of Southampton County on the 25th day of January 1828, on his own premises in the County of Southampton. This presentment was made upon the voluntary evidence of W^m P. Moore.

John Barkman and W^m B. Brantley for committing an affray by fighting in publick at Somerset in the County of Southampton on February Court day upon the evidence of W^m Murfee sent by the court at our request.

Solomon Barnes, Ichabod Peale and Allen Peale for an affray by fighting together in publick at Peles Hole in the County of Southampton on the 29th day of December 1827 on the evidence of two of our body Richard M. Carr & Mills L. Gray.

Samuel Vick, James Holt and two free negroes, Cotton Whidbey & Orris Clark for unlawful gaming on the 15th January 1828 in the County of Southampton on the evidence of Lewis Howell sworn in Court at the request of the grand jury.

James Vick (living in the neighbourhood of Marblehead) for an unlawful species of slaves at his house in the County of Southampton within the last twelve months and as a nuisance to the neighbourhood, on the evidence of Henry Blow and John Story who were sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury.

Bryant Hollands for an assault and battery on the person of Henry Fowler in the County of Southampton on the 25th day of February 1828, before the evidence of the said Fowler one of our body sworn in Court to give evidence.

Richard P. Clemente and William B. Brantley for making an affray by fighting in publick at Augustine H. Hart's sale in the County of Southampton on the 1st day of January 1828 upon the evidence of John Barkman who was sent for by the grand jury and sworn in Court to give evidence. And the said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.
