Edward P. Towner appeared in Court and resigned the Office of Constable in the upper district of Saint Luke's Parish in this County.

John Beckman is unanimously appointed Constable in the upper district of Saint Luke's Parish in this County in the room Edward P. Towner resigned. It appearing to the Court that this said Beckman is a man of honesty probity & good demeanor. Whereupon the said Beckman with Hanniss P. Pope and William J. Clarke his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars conditioned according to law. which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Beckman also took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States, the oath against duelling and the oath of office.

Joseph Whitehead's petition of James Whitehead with the approbation of the Court made choice of Joseph Prindle for his guardian, and thereupon the said Joseph Prindle with Robert Prindle and John Prindle his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Second Bridge this day made their report.

An account of Nathaniel P. Phillips of Virginia & George P. and Mary W. Parks was this day returned and ordered to be recorded.

His Commissioners on this date this day made a report which as on these words read, "We the Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Lynchburg on December Term, 1823 sell the land belonging to the estate of Henry Prindle, dec<sup>d</sup> on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of January 1823 for a term of 3 years to the highest bidder on a credit of six months John Prindle being the purchaser for four hundred and sixty dollars. After deducting the expenses of sale if there is a balance of four hundred and thirty one dollars & four cents for which we have taken equal bonds for each of the legatees except John Prindle he being the purchaser and retaining an equal portion as his share, which bonds we have approved as directed by the decree, to wit, one to James D. Haysburg as guardian of Henry D. Haysburg, one to David Holland, one to Robert Prindle as guardian of Elizabeth Prindle and has returned by Joseph & Robert Prindle. Robert D. Prindle, Joseph Prindle, James D. Haysburg."
