The Commissioners in this case this day made a report which is on these words to wit "With the sum of money appointed by the County Court of Southwicks (December Term, 1811) sold the land belonging to the estate of Mary Preller, in dñe on the 6th day of January 1812 for the sum of \$1000.00 to the highest bidder on a credit of six months. John Preller being the purchaser for four hundred and sixty dollars. After deducting the expense of sale & there is a balance of four hundred and thirty one dollars & four cents for which we have taken equal bonds for each of the trustees except John Preller, he being the purchaser and retaining an equal portion as the three others bonds we have agreed as described by the decree to wit, one to James D. & Hespelburg as guardian of Mary P. Mafifbury, one to Eunice Bellamy, one to Robert Preller as guardian of Elizabeth Preller and one retained by Joseph & Robert Preller. Robert D. Preller, Joseph Preller, James
