The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report which is as follows:  
Agreeable to a decree of the County Court of Southampton dated February Court 1847 and  
amended March Court 1847 and again amended December Court 1847 after giving due  
notice of the time and place of sale I sold to the highest bidder on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1848 the tract of land of which Martha Barrett died possessed containing by estimation  
sixty one acres more or less on a tract of twelve months, and Benjamin J. Barrett being  
purchase for the sum of three hundred and twenty four dollars. Also sold at the same  
time and place on the same terms in conjunction with Thos. H. Worrell Esquire  
appointed by another decree of the Court to sell the slaves and negroes of Mr. Henry  
Barrett, the said Martha Barrett's interest in her mother's slaves being one sixth part  
and the said Benjamin J. Barrett also became the possessor of the whole slave land for  
the sum of One thousand five hundred and five dollars,  $\frac{1}{6}$  part of which is £28.12s  
which added to £24.00 makes £574.83*10*s. the amount of the real estate of such  
Martha Barrett deceased for which sum I have taken bonds from said Benj. J. Barrett  
and Davis B. and his Sureties payable the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1849 and paid

Barrett deceased to the highest bidder as follows:-

I have also in conjunction with Thomas H. Worrell Esquire as aforesaid at the same time and  
place sold to the highest bidder said Martha Barrett's interest in her mother's slaves except  
the sales of such negroes who were sold and delivered amounting to £60*0**0* as will appear  
in Thomas H. Worrell's report, one sixth part of which is £10*13*.*6* which added to £122.00  
makes £224*0*.*6* the next sales negro from which deduct £*0* of £122.00 which is £224*0**6*  
for Mrs. Mary Barrett which I have paid over to her, leaves £220*4*.*2**9* from which deduct  
£10*0* for myself as Compt £20.00 for Lawyer & Clerk £12.10. also the sum of £2*8*.*8**0*  
and as a debt of said Martha Barrett December 31<sup>st</sup> 1847 leaves £225.88 of which  
I have paid £10*0* to Mary Barrett
