

On the motion of Lawrence B. Daughtery. Ordered that the Clerk of this Court give no execution upon a judgment obtained in this Court in favour of said Daughtery against Thomas Murray and Bryant Holland for eighty three dollars and eighty cents and the costs, to be discharged by the payment of \$21.90. with interest from 1st January 1842 till paid and the rest subject to a credit of \$29.75 paid May 27. 1842.

The Decree was awarded at the last Court against Bennett & Whifflet to show cause if any one could why the Indentured breeding Sary Ann Parks free negro to him should not be removed not being executed. It is ordered that a new Decree be issued against the said Bennett & Whifflet to the first day of the next Court.

The registers of Mabela Reid, William Blake, Martha Turner, William Reily, Anne Day, Elabore and Joseph Hunt free negroes were examined and certified to be truly made.

Ordered that all the acting Justices of this County be summoned to the first day of the next term for the purpose of appointing a juror for this County.

Ordered that proper process be issued against the persons this day presented by the grand jury who be here to the first day of the next Term.

On the motion of John Charles Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies on his negro woman Mary in future she being aged and infirm.

On the motion of W. L. Reddick Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies for his negroes Sabina & Ned in future they being aged and infirm.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
