Ordered that all the other Justices of this County be summoned to the first day of the next Court for the purpose of appointing a Survey for this County.

Ordered that proper process be issued against the persons this day presented by the grand Jury sworn before the first day of the next Term.

On the motion of John Charles Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies on his negro woman Abby in future she being aged and infirm.

On the motion of W. S. Reddick Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies for his negro Salina & Ned in future they being aged and infirm.
