On the motion of Patrick Dolan. Ordered that he be except from the payment of taxes & fees for his two slaves Ann and Mary infirm, they being aged and infirm.

An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Daniel St. Demynck deceased was returned and ordered to be recorded.

William J. Stephenson an indentured labor man in custody under an execution of the last of William Mullen administrator of Anthony Mullin deceased was this day brought into Court and submitted and delivered an account of his estate and made out therefrom according to law. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Stephenson be discharged from custody of detained from this time than the execution aforesaid.

On the motion of John Edwards who made oath and together with George H. Gardner and Willis Daniels his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificates granted him for attorney letters of administration on the estate of Sam Edwards deceased in due form.

Ordered that William L. Edwards, James Marfa and James D. Mapenburg being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appear all the personal estate of Sam Edwards deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

The last Will and Testament of Nicholas M. Debelle deceased was proved by the oaths of Joseph Murray and Robert Murray his wife of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of William J. Debelle the executor thereon named came made oath and together with his securities entered into bond in the penalty of Thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificates granted him for attorney a probate of the said will in due form the still directing that the securities should give no security and the Court requiring none.

Ordered that J. A. W. Asuron, J. J. Mahone, Joseph Murray and John M. Gandy or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Nicholas M. Debelle deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Lawrence Pepe. Ordered that he be except from the payment of taxes & fees for his negro man Ned, he being aged and infirm.

On the motion of Hall and Burland. Merchants in this County. The Court certifies that they are men of good character and that their store is a pleasant fit and convenient for the neighborhood in which it is situated for the retail of ordinary goods &c.

On the motion of John R. Williams against Hardyayay. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant hath had legal notice of this action he was formerly called but came not. Therefore it is concluded by the Court that the plaintiff is recover against the defendant forty five dollars and fifty five cents (the amount paid by the plaintiff as security for the defendant in discharge of a judgment in a sum judgment in the Court in favor of James D. Mapenburg executor of Captain Mandingay deceased) with legal interest.
