The Court certifies that they are men of good character and that their stores are places fit and convenient for the neighborhood in which they are situated for the retail of sundry goods &c.

An account of George B. Griffin's administration in the estate of John D. Herring dec^d was returned and ordered to be on file for exceptions.

A writing bearing date the 16th day of February 1847 purporting to be the last will and Testament of R. J. Summerville dec^d was produced in Court and there being no subscribing witnesses to the said will James B. Vezubert, Thomas Vezubert and William A. Summerville being sworn depose and say that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said R. J. Summerville who moved with and together with Samuel B. Wells and John Baykin his attorneys entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars conditioned as the law directly requires is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said R. J. Summerville dec^d with his well approved attorney as dec^d from.

Ordered that Samuel B. Wells, J. B. Vezubert & J. B. Vezubert being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of R. J. Summerville dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
