

Editha A. A. Lawrence, nephew of Richard H. Lawrence deceased, with the approbation of the Court and choice of William J. Tibbitt for his guardian and thereupon the said William J. Tibbitt with Edwards Dells and Arthur A. Denney his associates entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law.

Ordered that John D. Williams, Richard Parker and Meredith Holland do let to the Court and submit the repairs of little bridges at old Southgange, receive the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

Thomas B. Howell for and for James Davis, Benjamin C. Waller, John Stephenson, Geo. Howell, Henry B. Vaughan, Silas David, Parilla, Joel Bowen, Arthur Middleton, Lewis Cropper, George H. Tardner, Montague Bradshaw, Jerry Lewis, Gilbert Bond, David Vaughan, Sampson Johnson, Joseph Cobb, Donnell J. Cropper, Thomas Vaughan, and William Cobb were sworn a grand jury of inquest for the body of John Smith and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented Exum Spring for an unlawful assault and battery on the person of Wells Spring by beating him with a stick on the middle day of June 1828 in the County of Southampton in the voluntary witness of the said Wells Spring sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury. James Cook, of James, for returning an indictment without a license in the County of Ingham at different times in the latter part of the last and present year to B. Bond and there by the information of said Bond sent for by the grand jury and sworn in Court and after said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

A writing bearing date the 26 day of April 1829 purporting the last will and testament of John Pope was produced in Court for perusal and there being but one subscribing witness to said writing and it appearing to the Court that the body of the said writing and signature thereto to be that of the hand writing of the said Sampson Pope the Court refused to admit the said paper writing as record as the last will and testament of the said Sampson Pope. And on the motion of John Williams who read with and together with John Backhouse and John Pope his friends entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Sampson Pope deceased in due form.

On the motion of John Woodard. Ordered that James H. Tibbitt out of the profits of his words estate Thomas Woodard Henry Gray to the said John Woodard the sum of two dollars and thirty cents.

On the motion of Samuel B. Kille. Ordered that William D. Hood who is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for the purpose to take bills and adjust an account of said Kille a declaration on the estate of Polly Bond dec^d and make report thereof to Court.

5 An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Joseph Gray dec^d was this day taken and returned to be recorded.

Ordered that proper process be issued against the persons this day presented by the grand jury returnable to the first day of the next quarterly term.
