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and four dollars, ninety four cents the penalty of the said bond had been paid by him about two and in the brief captioned. And the said defendants in error &c. But this judgment is to be discharged by the payment of fifty seven dollars and ninety seven cents with legal interest thereon from the 18th day of July 1828 till paid and the costs.

It appearing to the Court that a slave belonging to Isaac Sayer of this County had been committed to the Jail of this County for being furnished by his mistress to go to Long and then himself returning to her. For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that the said slave be discharged from his confinement on said jail, the said Isaac Sayer paying the justice fee &c.

Shadrach a negro man slave the property of Allen Tappan of this County who has been committed to the Jail of this County charged with having on the 10th day of September 1828 feloniously killed and murdered Tom Shappard a free negro in this County, was this day set to the bar in custody of the keeper of the Jail of this County and being arraigned pleaded not guilty. Whereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined and the prisoner was fully tried on his defence by Counsel. On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court that the prisoner is not guilty of the murder as charged but that he is guilty of voluntary manslaughter. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the prisoner received twenty lashes on his bare back with laid on at the public whipping post, and that the Sheriff cause execution to be done forthwith and then discharge the prisoner from custody.

The Court doth assign Miles Norrell guardian to Eliza, Selma and Joseph M. Norrell children of Sige Norrell dec^d and thereupon he together with such Rouse and James Norrell his servants entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars conditioned according to law.

On the motion of Mildred Norrell. Ordered that Miles Norrell guardian of Eliza, Selma & Joseph M. Norrell pay her \$15 each for the last twelve months and \$15 each for the next twelve months for Eliza and Joseph M. Norrell out of the principal of said waste estate.

This day this cause was docketed by Counsel of parties and with like consent came on to be heard as a judgment order and decree that Ree B. Pierce who is appointed a Commissioner for the purpose set to the highest bidder, on a credit of twelve months, except costs sufficient to pay the costs of the suit and expenses of sale, after giving thirty days previous notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement and notices placed in the neighborhood, the land and slaves of Harriette T. Pierce dec^d and seized and possessed. That he take bonds and security of the purchasers, in such sum as he may see fit, in equal shares and that he pay to each of the following persons on each share and take there receipt therefor. Robt. Thomas A. Pierce, Lawrence O. Pierce, John S. Byrnes and
