

Which not but was shown divided into three equal shares of forty seven dollars and some cents and some apportioned one share to Simon Munroe as assignee of James H. Gardner, and have taken Simon Munroe bond for the like and for the benefit of Samuel Gardner infant child of James H. Gardner dec^d all of which is most respectfully submitted. Given under my hand this 10th of December 1846. Jas. W. Munroe

After the above was arranged and settled as reported it was ordered by the Court as follows: ordered that I Jas. W. Munroe Court should pay J. C. Langston debt and costs, of forty seven dollars and 51 cents, and clerk fee of 97^{cts}. Whereupon Simon Munroe refunded of his pocket eighteen dollars and sixteen cents and paid on each of the bonds sixteen dollars and sixteen cents making \$42.53.

Subsequently at June Court 1847 It was ordered that I Jas. W. Munroe Court should pay any claims duly authenticated. And it has been deemed as fit announced decree that I should pay to the Plaintiff claims & costs. Whereupon on the 8 th day of May 1848 Simon Munroe paid upon each note twenty six dollars and 51 cents and refunded of his as fit. first decree for only ten dollars and 51 cents, making eighty dollars and forty three cents to pay the following claims. And on 17th July 1848 Simon Munroe paid upon each note fourteen dollars and four cents one third cents and refunded of his portion as fit the first decree the same and \$18.53 making \$42.15 to pay Vize B. Edwards claim. Whereupon I Jas. W. Munroe Court paid the same \$23.17

The bonds with the credits as fit the report and the papers in the case is most respectfully submitted after paying the above claims as now herewith reported a net there is only ten dollars and seven cents exclusive of debt which is the principal due on each note.
