This cause came on this day to be heard on the present formerly cited and the report of the German printer Boggs filed at June Term 1819 and was argued by Counsel. It is considered by the Court that the said report is imperfect and defective in so far that it does not recommend to said Commonwealth with particularity the amount for which the land and slaves originally sold, and the several items of expense attending said sale, also the particular amount to which each party is entitled under the deed of January Term 1816, the amount retained by the several parties entitled under the said decree, and the said German printer is further instructed to return to Court with his report, the bonds and account in case due to now residents under the said decree before mentioned.

On the motion of Rebecca Woodson, Caroline Boggs, and Robert Taylor descendants of founders of the Hertford tribe of Indians. It is ordered that James H Parker, George W. Newson and Jeptha S. Bushnell trustees of the said tribe be summoned to the next Court to answer the said petition.

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertake the repair of the Bridge over the stream made this day made their report -

On the motion of Jeptha Little guardian to Benjamin Blanton. Ordered that he do owe to the said Benjamin Blanton one hundred and fifty dollars, and that he be allowed until May 1st in his account to be hereafter rendered.

For expenses appearing to the Court. It is ordered that the Owners of the poor school teaching an infant child of free negro & James H. Poole owing to law. And the Court consider that £20. will be the reasonable annual value of the said apprentices in the art trade or business whereby he is to be taught to commence from 1820 and that the Owners of the poor by whom this order shall be executed in addition to Indentures of apprenticeship shall take from the Master and with his fulling master especially agreed to double the value of the services of the apprentice for the whole term, and payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia to account to account for the value of said services according to law -

Ordered that the account of William Mifflin constable amounting to £25.88 be certified to auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertake the repair of the Esopus bridge this day made their report -

The register of Orman Bradshaw, Herbert Vines & Abel Dabney Clerks for original examination and certified to be duly made.

Order that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term -
