This day this cause came on to be heard by court on the bill and answer and was argued by counsel: On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Harrison D Moore who is hereby appointed a Special Commissioner for that purpose, after giving due notice of the time and place of sale, proceed to sell the said negro to the highest bidder for cash, and after paying the expenses of this suit, he pay over to Mary Moore widow of James E Moore one fifth of the remainder in place of her life estate. and that he return the balance as executor of James E Moore and report to this Court in order to a final decree.

An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Sampson Pope deceased was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Thomas J. Wynn orphan of Barham Wynn dec<sup>d</sup> with the approbation of the Court made choice of James H Mangrum for his guardian, and thereupon the said James H Mangrum with Jordan Edwards & Sol Mangrum his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to Law.

An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Nathaniel Boyd dec<sup>d</sup> was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report which is in these words to wit  
 "In obedience to an interlocutory decree Moore vs Moore" pronounced at Oct. term 1848 by the County Court of Southampton, your commissioners proceeded on Thursday the 23<sup>d</sup> day of August 1848, after having examined the different tracts of land whereof James J Moore dec<sup>d</sup> seized and possessed, and set apart and allotted to Maryann Moore the widow of said dec<sup>d</sup> as well for her dower for life, a part of the tract of land called and known as "old Southyong" bounded on the south by Black Water river, East by the lands of James Jenkins, and north by that part of the lands of said dec<sup>d</sup> called "the old place tract" to the east corner of the field called "straw" then along the fence which separates "Texas" from the horse field from thence bounded by the marsh to the east end of the long dam: thence along the lands of Seth D. Williams and the tract called the "darden tract" to Black Water river, thence up said river to the corner of James Jenkins' land, containing One hundred and twenty acres more or less. And on Saturday the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November we sold at public auction, on a credit of twelve months, except a sum sufficient to defray the expenses of the sale and costs of this suit, the remaining tracts of land (the time and place of sale having been advertised at the most public places in the County thirty days previous thereto: first the "Hornum tract" of 196 acres more or less. was put up when James Boyd dec<sup>d</sup> became the last bidder for the sum of \$ 196 00  
 The "Darden tract" of 75 acres more or less when Wm D Moore became the last bidder for 162 00  
 Lastly the "old place tract" of 200 acres more or less when Wm P. Moore became the last bidder for 200 00

Amounting to \$ 558 00  
 We then deducted \$ 12.35 Am: & costs see 4 5 p 01; commissions on \$ 500 @ 2 1/2 % p 12 50 making 38 85  
 leaving a balance of \$ 719 17
